IN WHICH THE NAME "EDERICHE" AND VARIANT SPELLINGS APPEAR

(recorded in Latin on rolls of parchment)

DEFINITION: The Manorial Court is frequently referred to as "VIEW OF THE FRANK-PLEDGE" - "frank-pledge" being the system, under old English law, whereby each male member of a tithing 12 years old or older was answerable for the gond conduct of, or the damage done by, any one of the other members. Originally a "tithing" was a company of 10 householders.

The Court and View of Edward Fawkoner there held on Saturday in the vigil of Holy Trinity in the 50th year of the reign of King Edward III after the Conquest... 1376 ... THOMAS EDRICH has made a pit in the King's way and (June 7) taken away loam to the common use without licence to the hurt. etc.

The Court of Edward Fawkoner held there next after the feast of SS. Simon and Jude in the 50th year of the reign of King Edward III.....and it is ordered 1376 that THOMAS EDRICH fill up the pit which he has made in the King's way under pain of 12 d against the next court.

The Court and View etc. THOMAS EDERICH has not filled 1377 the pit as he was ordered in the King's way - therefore (May) 6d pain to be levied.

The Court held there Monday next after the feast of Pentecost in the 23rd year of the reign of King Henry VI after the Conquest. JOHN EDERYCH, junior, comes into court and surrenders by the hands of Richard Hale and John Bursar 6 acres lying at Le Smyth Hill.....to the use of THOMAS EDERYCH and heirs, etc.
